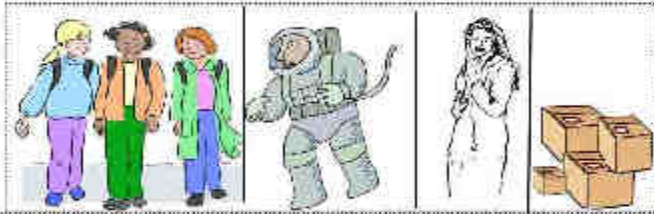

Look around your town to discover jobs on the go! Trucks, buses, cars...Count how many there are!

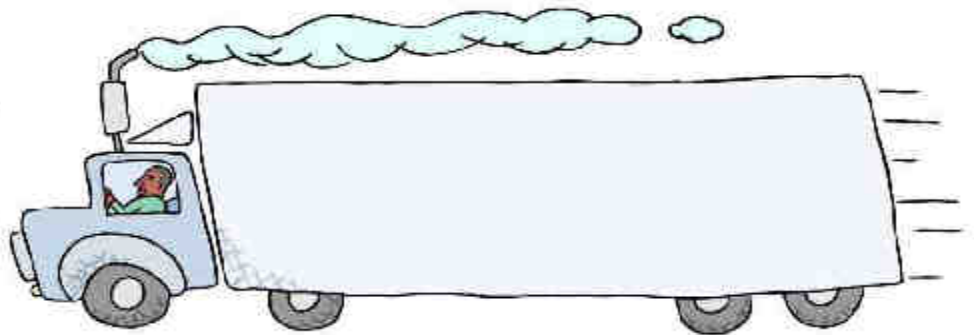
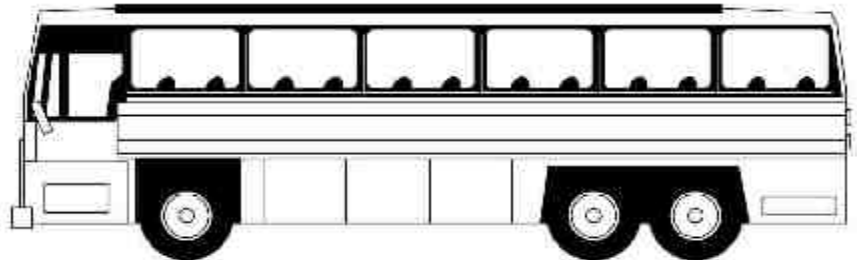

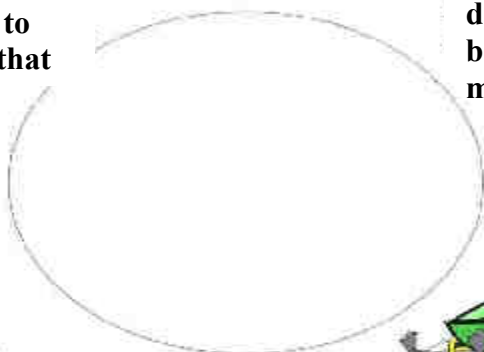
On the go on land...

Color, cut, and match the road, tracks, snow, and farm to the correct picture below. Then read more to learn about these on the go land jobs.

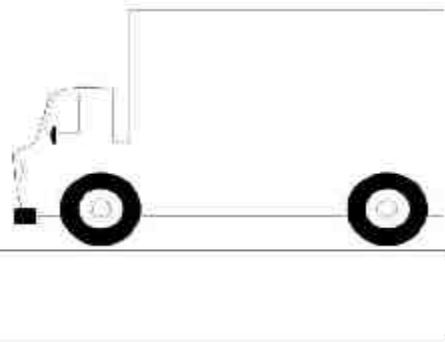


On the go on land...

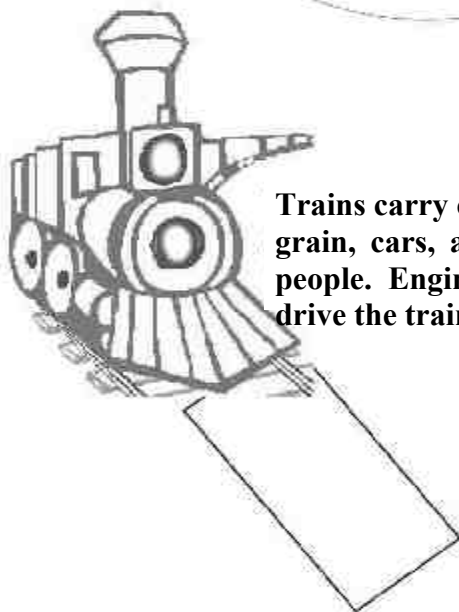
Ski patrollers use snow mobiles to rescue skiers that are hurt.



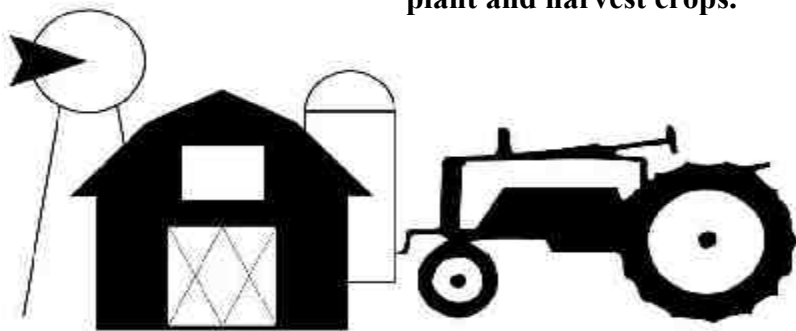
Delivery truck drivers bring boxes, food, and mail.

Trains carry coal, grain, cars, and people. Engineers drive the trains.



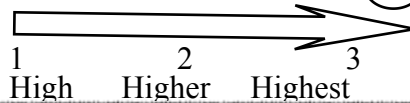
Jobs in the air!



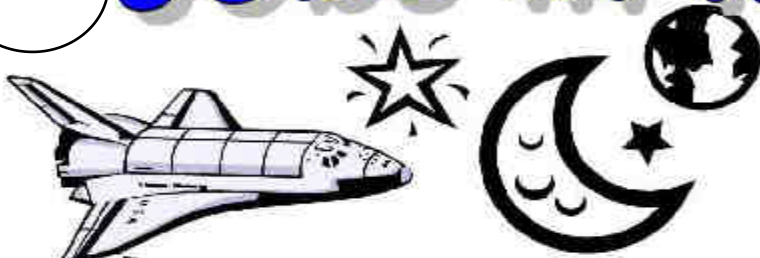

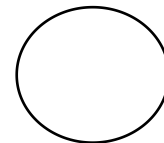

On the go in the sea!

The coast guard makes sure people follow the laws in the ocean to be safe.



The U.S. Navy works on aircraft carriers in the ocean so planes can take off and land in the water.



Cruise ships have many jobs on board such as captains, nurses, waiters, dancers, and chefs.



Fishermen fish for crabs, lobster, fish, shrimp, and other sea food to sell for people to eat.



Aquatic scientists study plants and animals in the water. Divers take pictures and make movies of sea life.

The Navy uses submarines to get information about other ships underwater.
