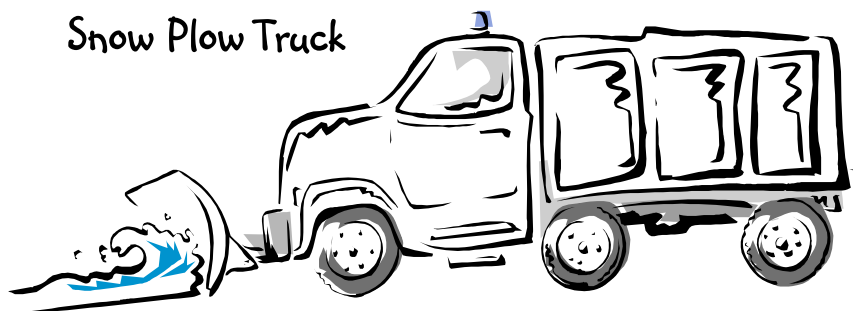

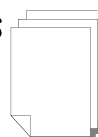

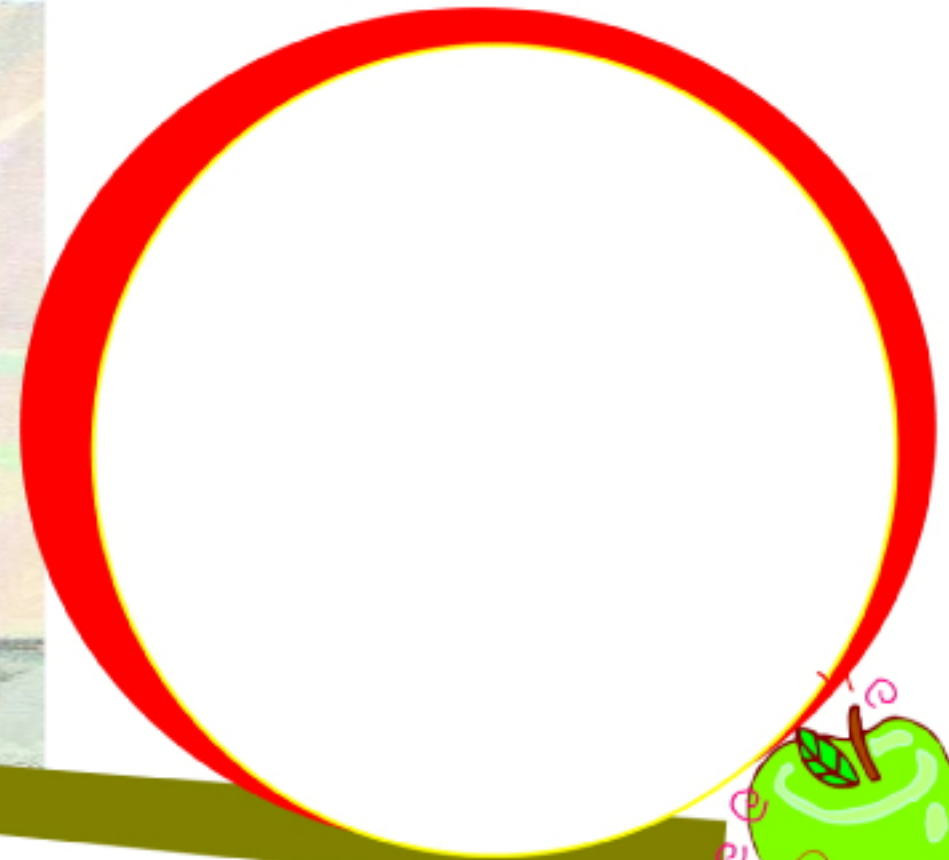

Winter Jobs

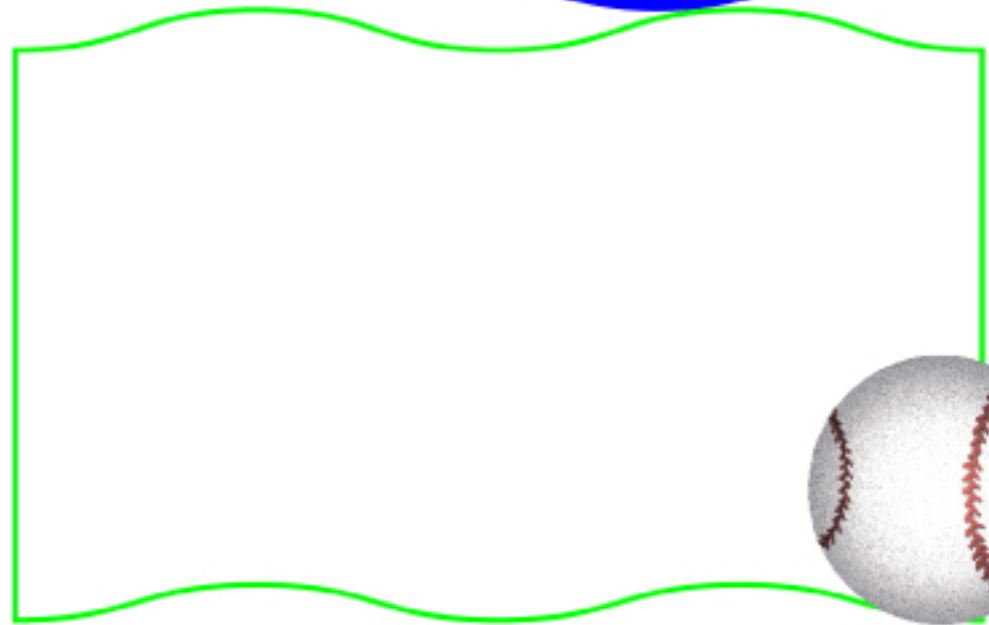
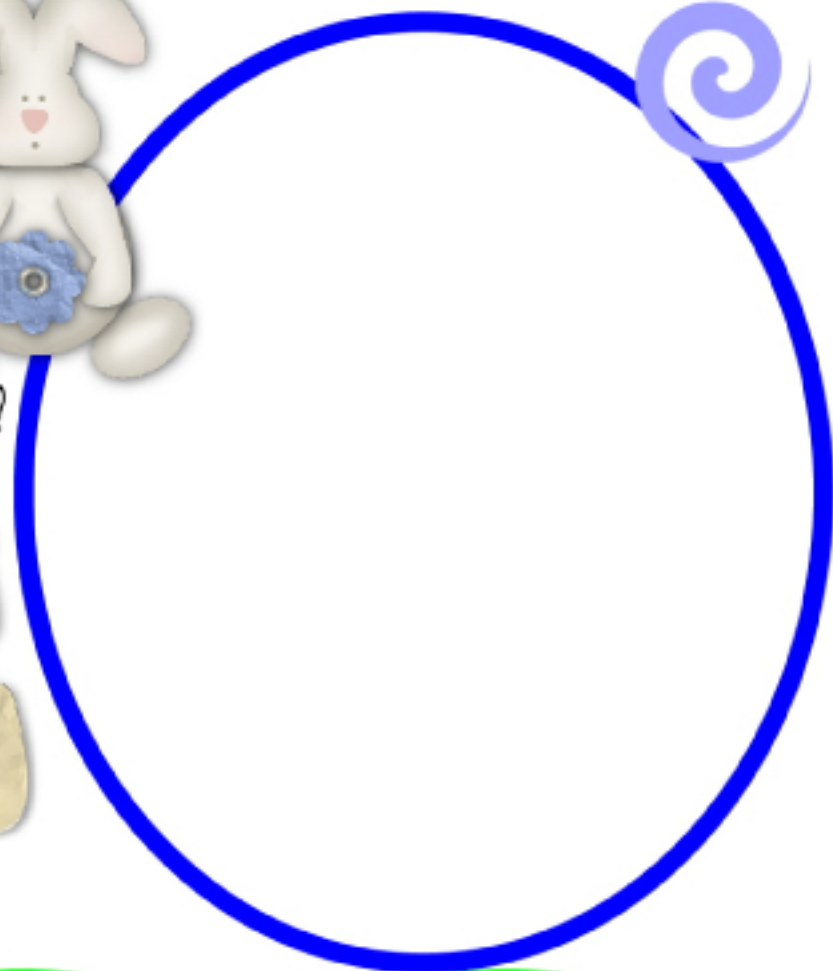
People in winter jobs may work with snow, trees, holiday gifts, singing, decorating, and more. Draw 2 winter jobs.
